

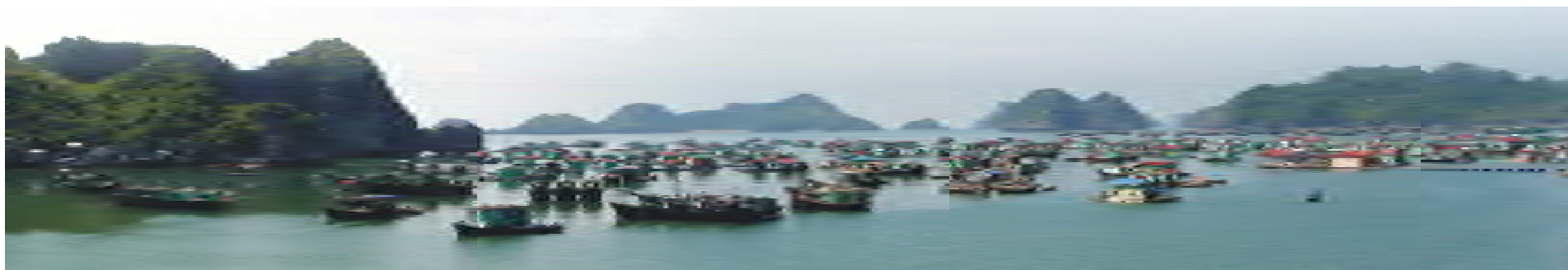

A beautiful rehabilitated mangroves. A 'green lungs' of the city



Dong Nai, 2001

Co-management of 5 provinces; 3 core zones; 11 ethnic groups.



Cat Ba, 2004

Golden-headed langur; quality economy, sustainable development fund



Red River Delta, 2004

Co-management of 3 provinces, bird migratory sites



Kien Giang, 2006

3 core zones, conservation of Dugon



Western Nghe An, 2007

Green corridor linking 3 protected area and culturescape



Mui Ca Mau, 2009

Transition area between mangrove and Melaleuca forests



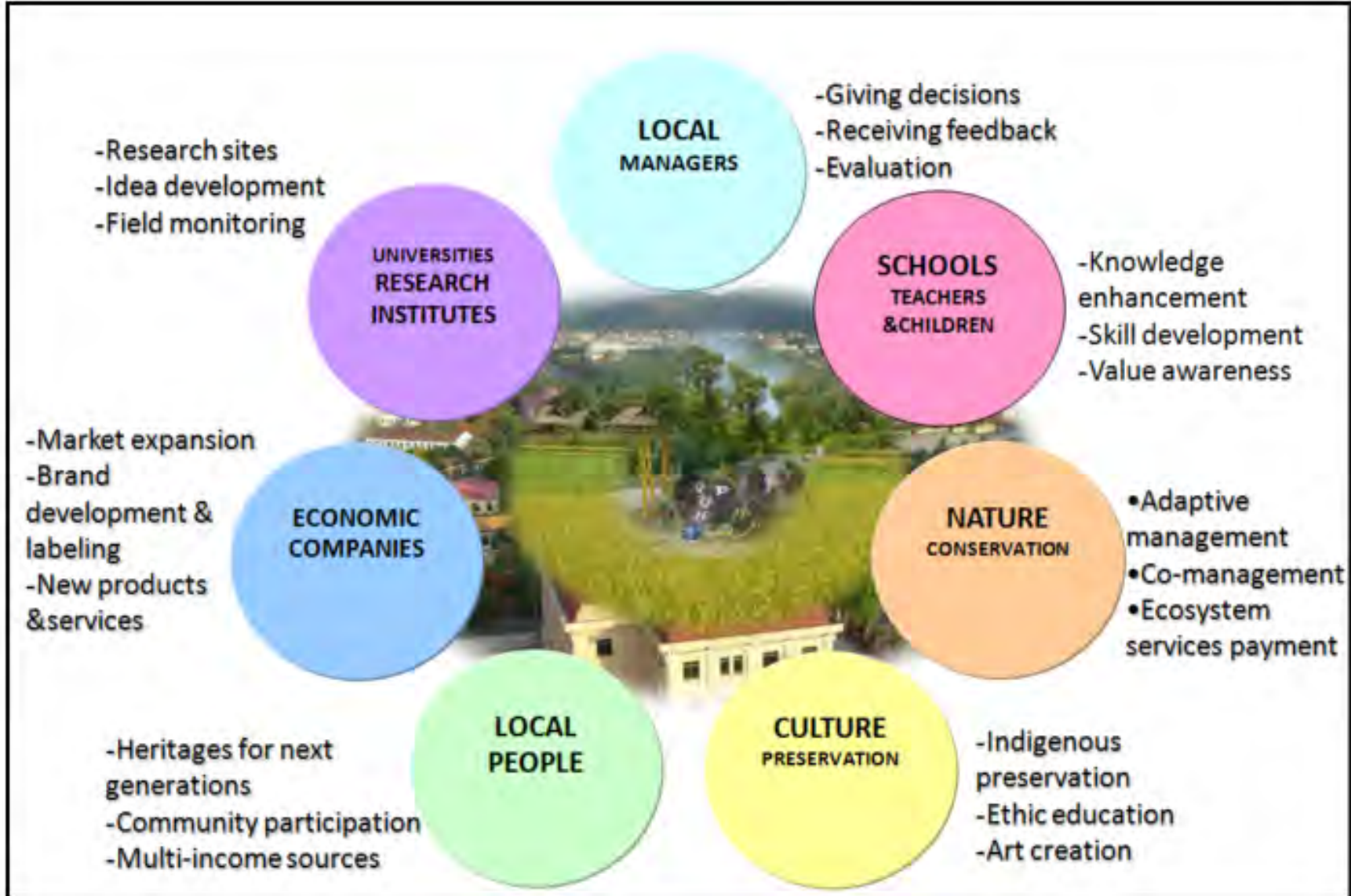
Cu Lao Cham - Hoi An, 2009

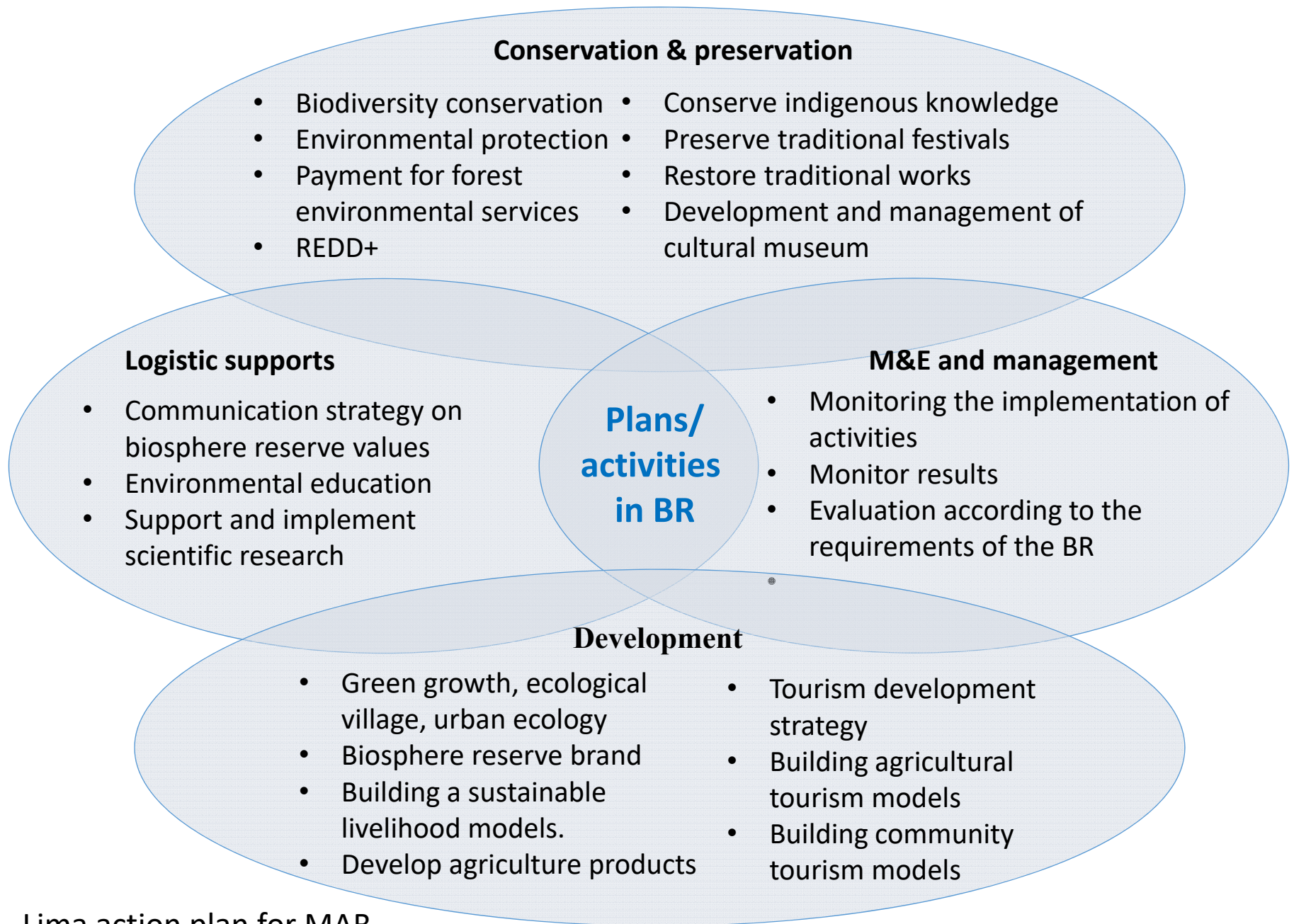

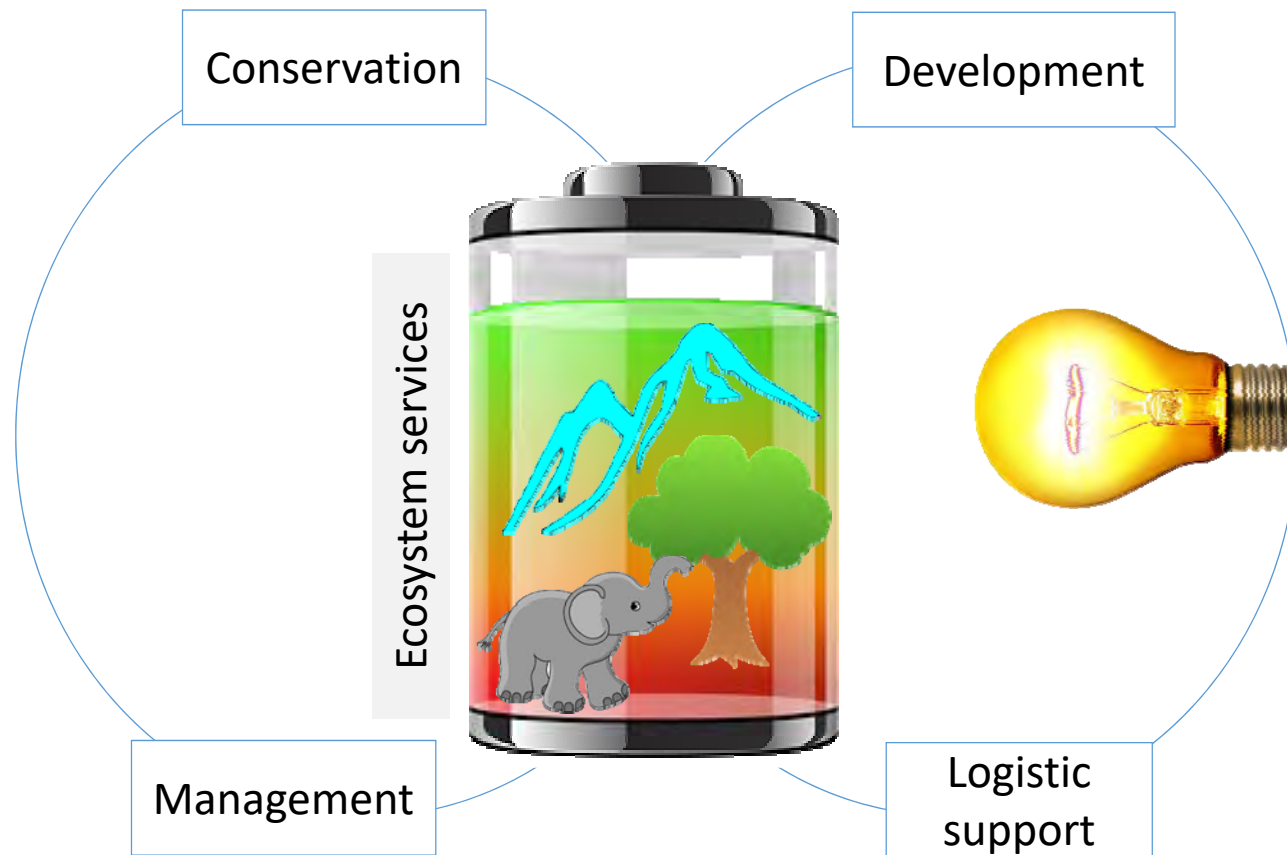

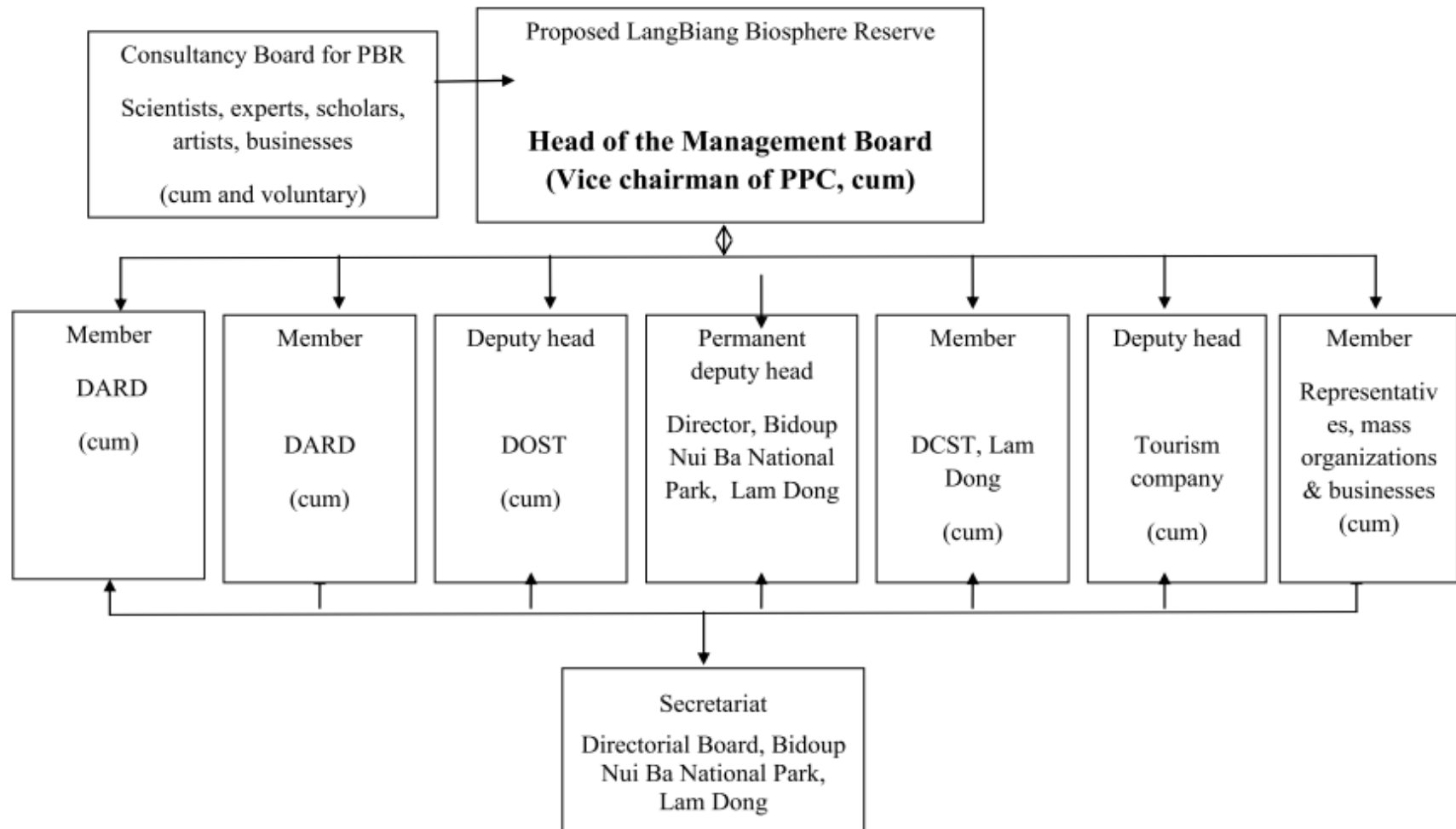


Lima action plan for MAB

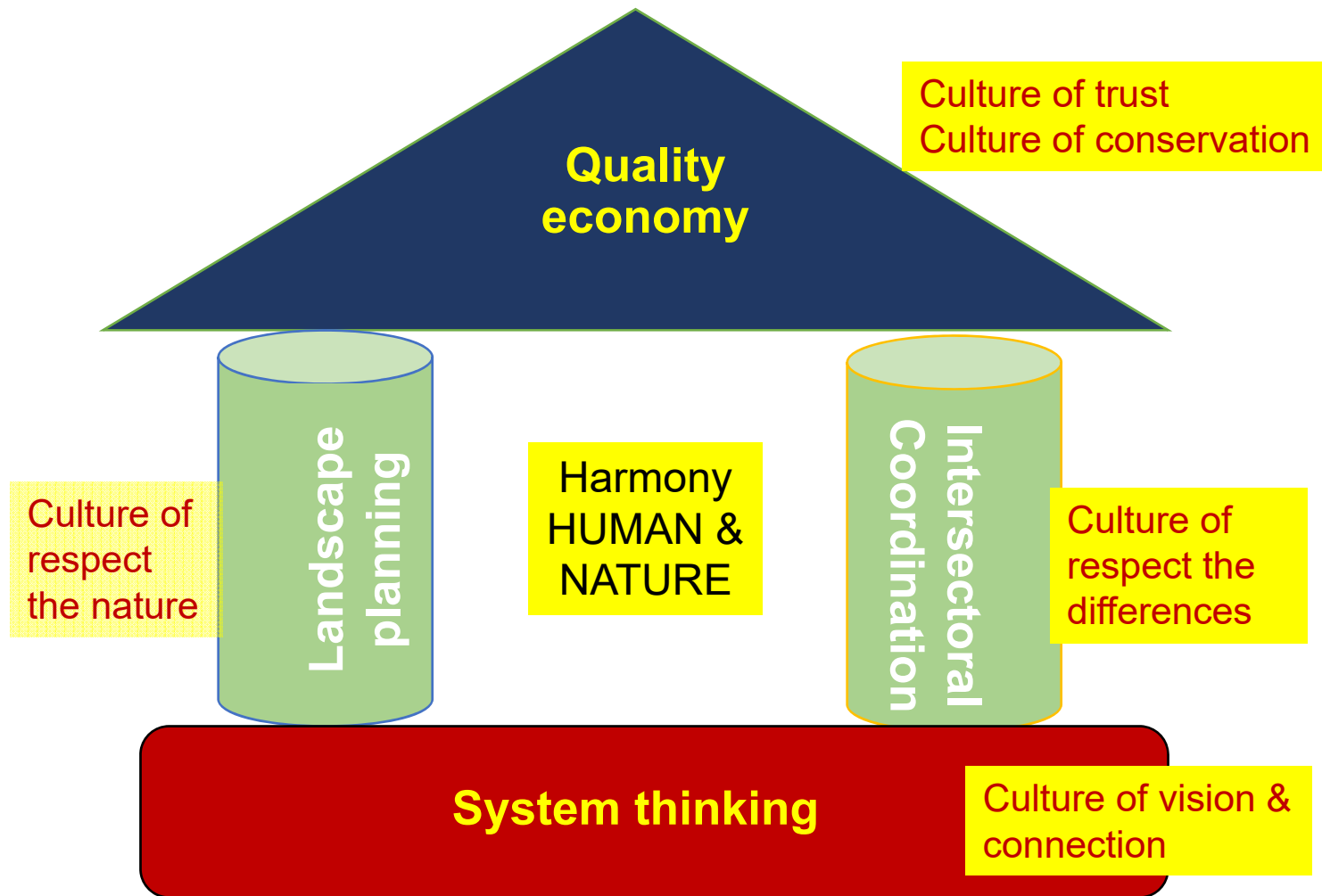
Concept of Biosphere reserves



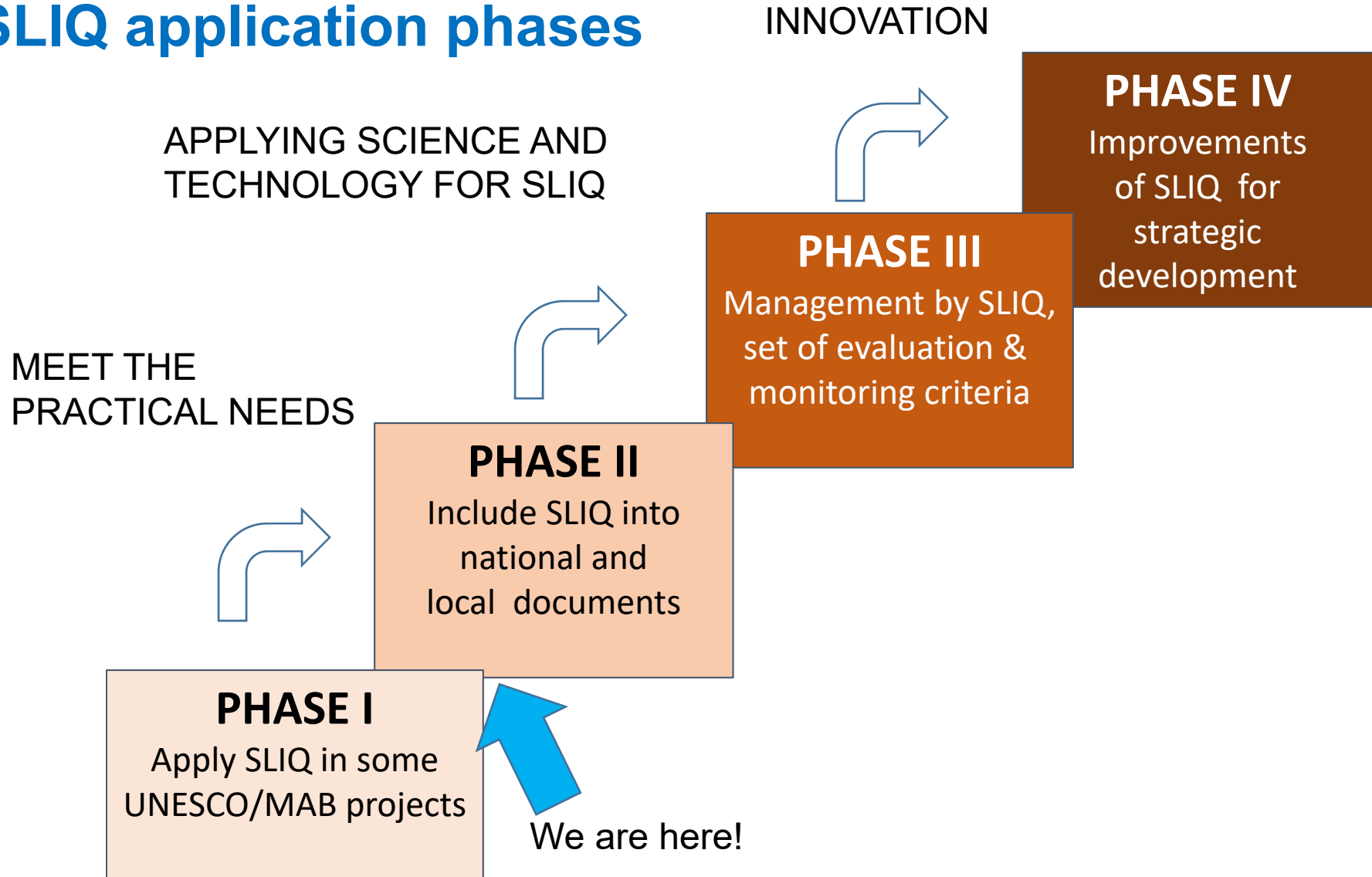
Typical management structure of BRMB in Vietnam (e.g of Langbiang BR)



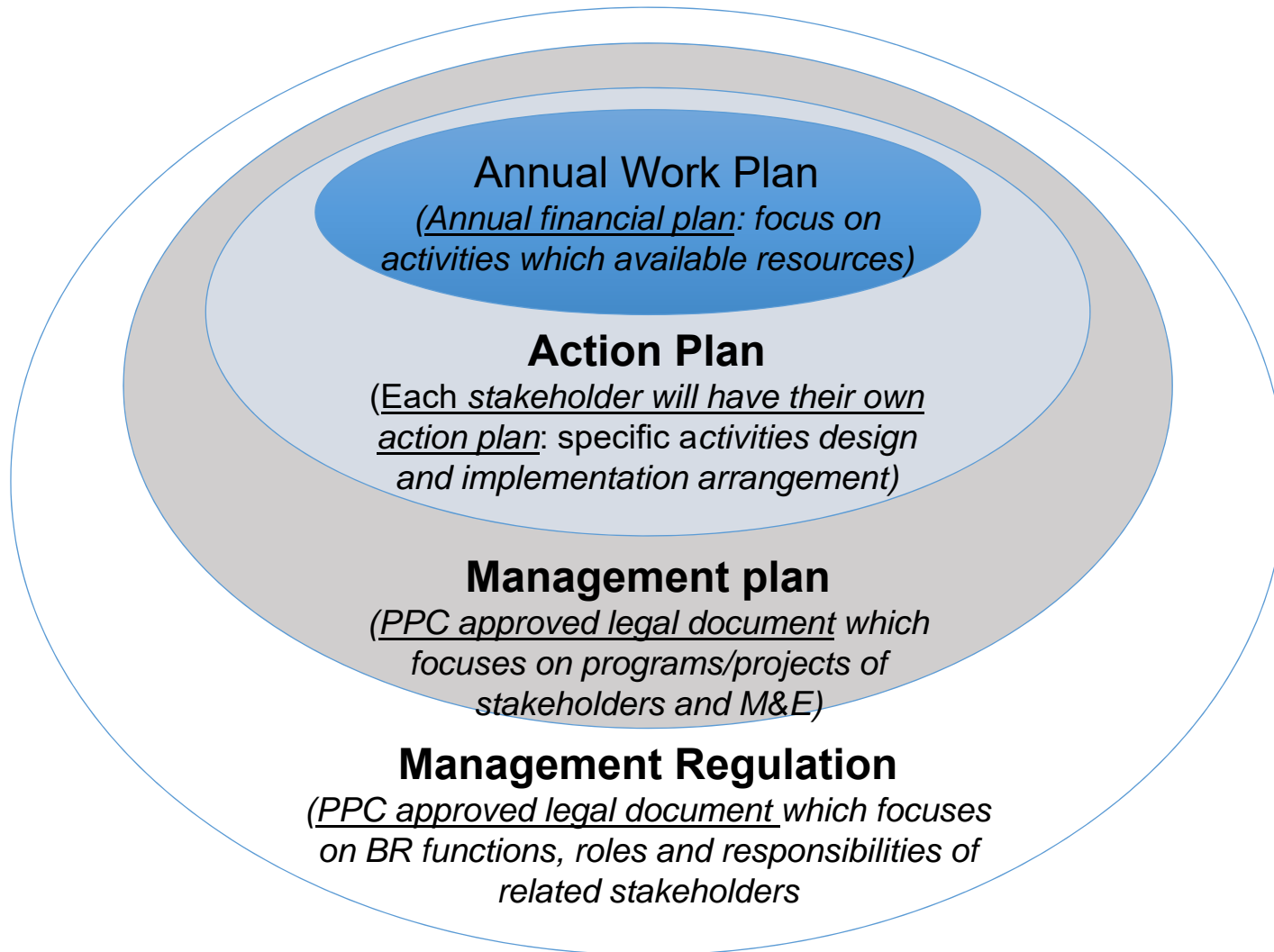
SLIQ – A management approach for BR in Vietnam



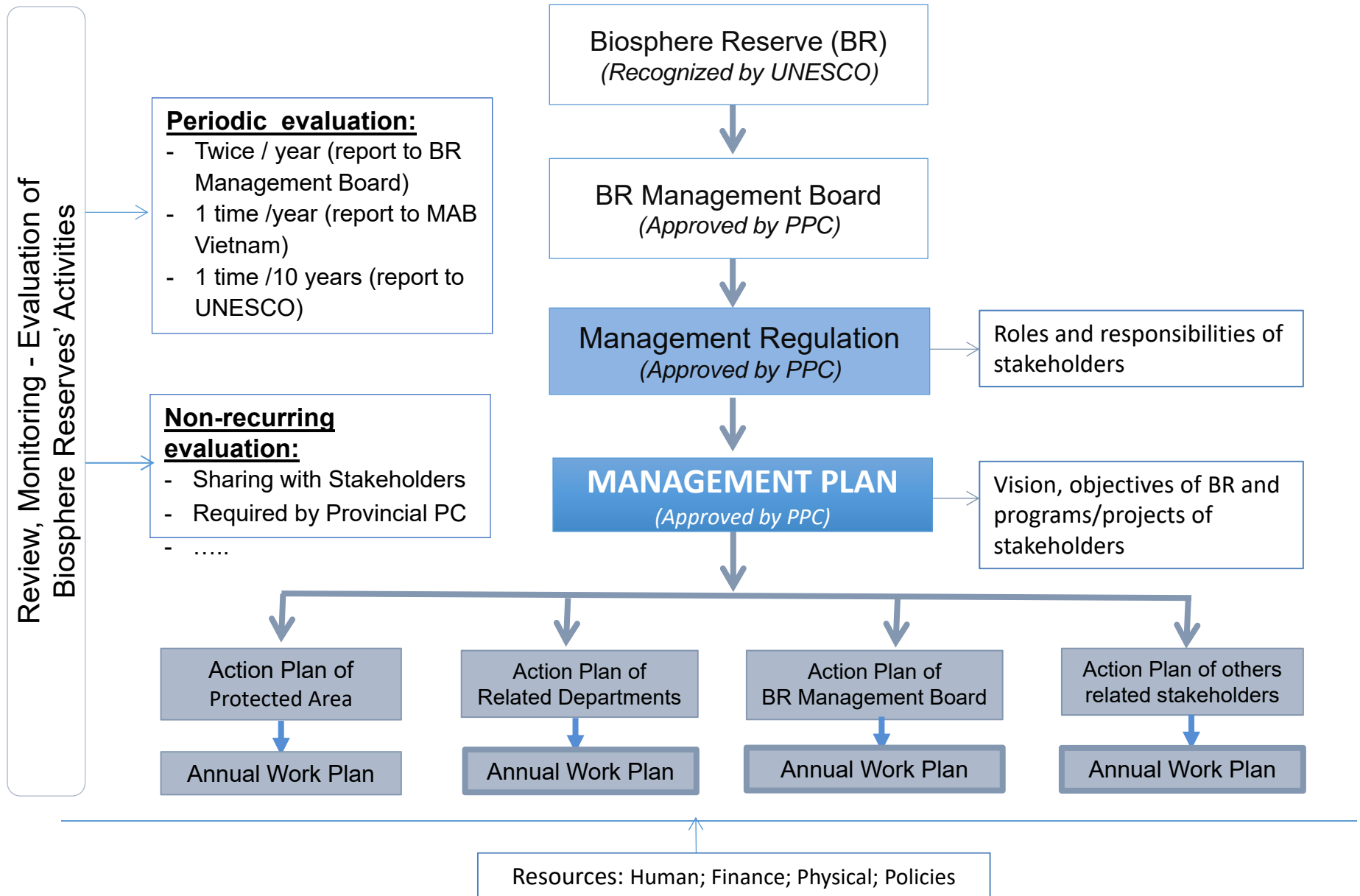
SLIQ application phases
